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GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE- Aim & presentation

AIM: guidance on the application of the competitive procedure

- selection of implementing bodies in case of simple programmes
- non-public organisations acting as applicants/beneficiaries
- to the competent authorities of the Member States

GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE - Context

- The legislative framework:
 - The basic act
 - Delegated Regulation
 - Implementing Regulation
- Grant Agreement (GA)
 - Article 10 Implementation of action tasks by subcontractors
 - Article 9 Purchase of goods, works and services



GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE- Best value for money

- 'best value for money' alias 'best price-quality ratio'
- price is an essential yet not the sole aspect/criteria
 - > not automatically necessary to select the offer with the lowest price
- the criteria defining 'quality' must be clear and coherent with the purposes of the action task that is subcontracted.
- competitive selection procedures would not be always required
 - ! However, beneficiary to demonstrate how best value for money was ensured.



GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE - Conflict of interests

When shared interests influence or affect contract's/subcontract's selection/award procedure and/or implementation of the programme.

Shared interests may be

- economic interests,
- political or national affinity,
- family or emotional ties or
- any other shared interest.



GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE- Competitive procedure guidelines

- Basic act requires a competitive procedure in all cases, irrespective whether a proposing organisation is non-public or public
- Implementation of promotion programmes via subcontractors not confined to a limited part thus the amounts from EU budget may be substantial



GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE- Competitive procedure guidelines

Member States to establish a 'competitive procedure' laying down the criteria non-public organisations taking account that

- the procedure is proportionate to the economic importance
- while the fundamental principles of the EU Treaty are observed.

It would consist at least of:

- the contract notice is published and adequately advertised;
- sufficient time for the receipt of tenders is provided;
- an objective and non-discriminatory evaluation of the tenders
- the assessment of any possible conflict of interests.



GUIDANCE ON COMPETITIVE PROCEDURE

- Competitive procedure guidelines

- low-value contracts
 - a negotiated procedure without publication of a contract notice with consultation of at least three candidates, or any other alternative method ensuring that the best value for money has actually been achieved
- existing framework contract
 - if conditions (best value-for-money and absence of conflict of interests) were respected at the time of their award

NB existence of national rules on competitive procedure may be subject to audit within the conformity clearance procedure
